Access for All to Tiverton Village Hall

Changes are afoot at Tiverton Village Hall and work on our access scheme will start on 24 July. So the hall will be closed for 6 weeks whilst the access is improved, and we are then re-opening for the Garden Club Annual Show on 2 Sept with a bit of a celebration of our new access a week later on Sat 9th Sept. All villagers are invited to join with the management committee in celebrating the biggest change to the hall since it was rebuilt in 1984.

As you will know, Tiverton Village Hall provides a centre for activities, both social and educational with a minimum of travel and accessibility to the hall is a key issue, especially for the elderly Our lack of land and elevation from road to front entrance (over 2m) has represented a real challenge to come up with an appropriate scheme. So after years of researching many options from powered lifts to long serpentine ramps, we have finally settled on an improved steps scheme that will be of great benefit to those who struggle with our current steep steps. Instead of the 7 existing steps, we will be installing 20 steps with a much shallower rise of 10cm, which is less than the roadside curb height, and deep enough (1m) to allow a buggy or wheelchair to rest on each step.

With better summers in prospect, we are thinking more of outdoor activities and part of the project will provide a large, level paved area with improved landscaping for outdoor events. The hall faces south, so the frontage should be a real sun trap during the day.

In looking to the needs of the elderly, we have not forgotten the inside. As the outside work is being carried out, we will be fitting a hearing aid loop to help out with the many speaker events that are hosted by the Village Hall.

All this comes at a price and we have been very fortunate in attracting over $\pounds 18,000$ in funding from the landfill tax money of Waste Recycling Group, distributed by WREN, our major funder, as well as funding from Chester City Council (Rural South Area Committee), the Parish Council and user organisations.
