## Highlights from the Parish Council Meeting

After vigorous protests from neighbours, actively supported by the Parish council, an enforcement notice is to be served on Houghton Poultry at Tiverton Heath in an attempt to restrict the poultry rearing activity to the sandstone barn; all recently erected wooden poultry sheds are expected to be removed.

A bid to secure £11,000 to improve the turning arrangements for overheight lorries at the junction of A49 and Huxley lane was unsuccessful and lorries will continue to demolish the wooden railings on the very tight turning circle. The recent Highways project to improve the turning circle was only partially successful due to the presence of underground services close to the corner.

The Old Red Fox is being converted to an Indian Restaurant by the same group that operates the Indian Restaurant in Tattenhall. They have applied for permission to operate a take-away service at Four Lane Ends in addition to operating a regular reataurant service.

### **Waste News**

Past issues of this Newsletter have encouraged recycling of waste as an alternative to landfill, in the hope of reducing landfill tax payments and avoiding turning more land into rubbish tips. But did you know that landfill also contributes to CO2 emissions (the methane from rotting waste is burned off). # Village Hall News

The Hall Committee are moving ahead with replacing the aging, yellow plastic chairs (they were obtained second hand when the hall was re-opened in 1984). A recent grant application to the Rural South Area Panel has succeeded in obtaining £1800 towards the replacement cost of £2500. The new chairs will have padded seats as well as being much easier to store when not required for functions.

To make better use of the amplification equipment installed last September, the hall has also added a CD player that can be used by any group hiring the hall.
