Chairman's Letter continued

With Cllr. Mike Jones of CWaC present there was a long discussion about what the Parish Council saw as the failings, in practice, of the current planning and planning enforcement system. Cllr. Jones agreed that the views and interests of the Parish Council and local residents usually lost out when opposed by a determined commercial developer who knows how to work the system. However, the Coalition Government's planned Localism Bill intends to give local communities more influence over the planning process for local housing and commercial developments. In this context it is of critical importance that the Parish Council, in consultation with the local community, updates the Village Plan and includes a "neighbourhood development plan", which will provide the framework for future planning applications. The Council intends to start on this important work as soon as possible.

Chairman's Letter

At the Parish Council meeting on 11th January 2011 there was a long discussion, prompted by Phyllis Armitage, the parish re-cycling champion, about Cheshire West and Chester's recent consultation and new plastic re-cycling policy. For some reason Tiverton residents seem to have missed out on some of CWaC's information leaflets.

For anyone not yet up-to-speed on what can and cannot be re-cycled see CWaC's website under "Improved Plastic Re-cycling"; http://www.cheshirewestandchester.gov.uk/waste_and_recycling/reducing_your_waste/improved_plastic_recycling.aspx, where there is an excellent check-list. Details can also be found on a new re-cycling page on the village website.

Roger Blake reminded us that, if people wish to avoid the higher cost of 0845, 0870 and similar telephone numbers, they should consult the website; www.saynoto0870.com, and select "search for alternative number". Roger also notified the Council that he intends to step down as Home Watch champion, so volunteers for a replacement are welcome.

An application has been lodged for a grant for the refurbishment of the War Memorial. Following requests from the public CWaC have agreed to erect roadside signs for Beeston Brook and Brassey Green, so as to help preserve the identity of hamlets within the parish.

Under new policies from CWaC, all street cleaning and grass cutting will be carried out by CWaC from April 2011, in the interests of providing a uniform service throughout the county and avoiding duplication of work or costs. It falls to me, therefore, to thank Harold Withe, whose services will no longer be required, for the excellent work he has done over the years in keeping the parish looking its best.
