Chairman's Notes

Red Fox Junction

Following the last Newsletter, we have been reassured by Cheshire West & Chester Highways that the work at re-configuring the Red Fox junction will start in January. We are told that the delay was caused by the need to do some last-minute changes to the original design (now apparently agreed) and the tendering process. At the same time, we have been pushing to get the (already agreed) plans to reduce the speed limit to 50mph implemented. I am pleased to say that the process of consulting people with properties along the A51/A49 that are directly affected by this speed change has now taken place, so progress is being made. Unfortunately, I have no information regarding the timings of this implementation.

Water Bursts

We also had a very quick response from United Utilities regarding a letter we wrote to their Chief Executive about the frequent mains water bursts down Huxley Lane. As a result, we had two United Utilities representatives attend the last Parish Council meeting in November. As an interim measure the mains water pressure in Huxley Lane has been reduced to 2.5bar. This is just under half of what it was but is still above the minimum pressure that they are obliged to provide. They also assured us that they had no plans to reduce this further. It would appear that this has had the desired effect in terms of reducing the frequency of mains water bursts. There is, however, even better news in that Huxley Lane is scheduled to have a new mains water pipe installed in 2020. Outline plans indicate that a new pipe will be laid from the A49 along Huxley Lane to (about) Crib Lane. Further updates will be provided as and when available.

Operation Shield

In my last note I asked for some feedback from residents regarding Operation Shield. We only had expressions of interest from one resident, which I think indicates quite clearly that there is no desire from our community to implement this initiative. As a result, the Parish Council will not look to progress with this.

Local Bus Services

Thanks to a local resident I became aware in October that Cheshire West & Chester Transport were carrying out a consultation with Tarporley Ward regarding their bus services. This became a cause for concern for two reasons – one because we were not invited to take part (because we are in Tattenhall Ward not Tarporley) and secondly because it asked for feedback regarding the twice weekly bus service from Tiverton to Chester as well as the Community Car Service. This was all somewhat frustrating because we had spent a considerable amount of time and effort earlier in the year lobbying to keep our existing bus service. In the end because there was insufficient time for us to properly take part in this latest consultation I wrote to CW&C Transport, re-iterating our position that we need to have as a minimum a weekly service from Tiverton to Chester. We await the outcome of their review with interest.

Tiverton & Tilstone Fearnall Website

Beeston Castle Bronze Age Roundhouse Project.

English Heritage plans to construct a replica Bronze Age roundhouse within the Outer Bailey of Beeston Castle between January and June 2019. The objective is to illustrate an important but often neglected era of the Beeston site, compared with the very visible but much later Norman castle remains. The completed roundhouse will be a tourist attraction in itself, but it will also be used for a variety of educational purposes.

A specialist team of volunteers will be trained to construct the building using original tools and original construction techniques, as far as is practical, given modern health and safety considerations. There will be five separate weeks of intensive training between January and May, devoted respectively to timberwork, thatching, wattle-and-daub walling, flooring and furniture/utensils, with two days per week construction work in the intervening weeks. The completed dwelling will be fitted out with replica Bronze Age furniture, cooking utensils, spinning and weaving equipment etc.

The project is in Beeston Parish, of course, but it does fall within our Neighbourhood Plan Area and the Parish Council welcomes and supports this development, as adding an important asset for the enjoyment of the local community as well as for visitors. The project is currently awaiting planning permission from Cheshire West and Chester.
