Funding Opportunities

Update to the Council's grants scheme: The criteria for applications to CWaC's Community Response Fund and Member Budgets have been amended for greater clarity on what it can fund. The schemes are not available for Personal Protective Equipment (PPE), including hand sanitisers, visors etc. The criteria has been clarified in line with guidance from Public Health UK.

Domestic Abuse support

Some children and adults could be facing increased risks due to need to stay at home because of COVID-19. Social distancing and self-isolation could also be used as a tool of coercive and controlling behaviour by people with abusing behaviours and will shut down routes to safety and support. To support anyone facing domestic abuse a new Open the Door poster has been produced specifically with COVID-19 in mind to direct people with domestic abuse concerns to local and national support, which supports the national #youarenotalone campaign.

Future Events

The end of the UK's 'lock-down' has not yet been announced and as such the many posts on social media proposing community parties to celebrate its end and VE day are premature.

For clarity the guidance remains unchanged – there should be no social gatherings taking place until the government changes this policy.

The Council position on events is that they will not be supported until the current cut-off date at the end of June. This date is being regularly reviewed and will only change in accordance with national guidance.

Volunteering

A Volunteer partnership comprising the Council, Cheshire West Voluntary Action, the Sector Leadership Group, Cheshire Community Action and community groups has recruited 1800 volunteers of which some 800 have been matched with charities and groups needing more support.
